



- CAREFULLY CUT ALONG LINE TO PRESERVE BOTH SIDES OF THE CUT
- 2. FLIP PIECES "B" AND "D" OVER TO CREATE CORNER





## **CORNER**



## NOTES:

- 1. ALWAYS START CAPPING WALL FROM THE LOWEST ELEVATION.
- 2. LAY OUT CAPS PRIOR TO USING ADHESIVE.
- CUT CAPS TO FIT. OCCASIONAL CUTTING WILL BE NECESSARY FOR RADII OTHER THAN APPROXIMATELY 7.5 FEET.
- 4. ALTERNATE SHORT AND LONG CAP FACES EVERY OTHER CAP TO ACHIEVE A STRAIGHT ROW OF CAPS.
- 5. USE EXTERIOR-GRADE CONSTRUCTION ADHESIVE TO SECURE CAPS.
